DSE Policy

The Company abides by and accepts as a matter of Policy its obligations under:
The Display Screen Equipment Regulations 1992 as amended 2002.

The purpose of this policy is to ensure that the risks to health of users of display screen equipment are minimised.

European legislation demands that minimum health and safety standards are provided by the employer for all users of work display screen equipment (DSE) in order to ensure their health and welfare.

Employers are obliged to perform a suitable and sufficient assessment of the health and safety risks to which users are exposed, and put in place a plan of corrective action to reduce the risks as necessary. An assessment is to be reviewed by the employer if there has been a significant change in the matters to which it relates, or if the employer suspects it is no longer valid.

Workstation Assessments will be undertaken as soon as is reasonably practicable after a computer workstation has been set up or significant changes have taken place. Responsibility for ensuring these assessments are completed rests with line management. All legal requirements will be complied with regarding the provision of suitable work equipment, including health or eye tests if required.

The company will make available sufficient information to allow its employees to work in a safe manner. Where it is identified that specific health and safety training in the use of DSE is required then this will be provided. Responsibility for ensuring that employees receive the necessary training rests with line management.

All users of display screen equipment will complete a self-assessment form for their workstation. This assessment must be carried out using the approved company document.

DSE training will be supplied for users, covering the associated risks and safe behaviour and practices.
