Manual Handling Policy

The company abides by and accepts as a matter of Policy its obligations under:

The Manual Handling Regulations 1992 – as amended 2002

The company recognises its “legal” duty under the mentioned legislation to ensure that manual handling tasks are reduced / avoided as far as is reasonably practicable and that wherever possible mechanical handling devices / systems are used.

It is company policy that all:

That every step will be taken to avoid the need for employees to carry out Manual Handling Operations (MHO) which involves a risk of being injured.

Where it is not reasonably practicable to avoid MHO, a suitable and sufficient risk assessment of all such MHO taking into account the task, the load, the working environment and individual’s capability.

Work will be organised so that the requirement for manual handling is reduced as much as possible and that anyone on their own should not lift materials weighing more than 25 kgs.

The Directors of the Company fully understand the need for all employees to be trained to carry out their work in a safe and proper manner. A training programme is in operation and this will be reviewed by the Director responsible for Health and Safety along with the Operations Director.

Manual handling training; will be delivered to every employee who must undertake manual handling operations as part of their allotted tasks - both at the start of their employment and thereafter at regular intervals and individuals’ capabilities will be assessed.
